This is Patricia Briskin, one of your constituents in Region 2.

I am unable to go in person to the meeting tonight, but plan on viewing the meeting on my tablet.

I have emailed you before, of my concern that we do not lose our San Bruno Police officers to other cities who offer a better salary. I continue to believe this is a big problem, as San Francisco Police are soon to get an approved 14% pay increase.

I understand that our neighbor Millbrae uses the San Mateo Sheriff for policing and that only 2 officers work their night shift. Consequently, if these 2 sheriff police need back-up, they call on our police to assist! Looks like the situation is dire, since our police are already working on a thin workforce. We have already lost officers to San Francisco and other cities.

I am concerned that with the numerous new home constructions in our city, that the city will not be prepared for our new enlarged city of the near future. We must plan for a larger tax base that can cover an adequate police force.

Please vote for a stronger pay package for our police, and ASAP.
