- 1. Meeting called to Order by:** Committee Chair Robert Riechel at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall Conference Room #113.
- 2. Roll Call:** showed Peter Carey (excused), Anne Dellinger (present), Roberto Donlucas (present), Marie Kayal (present), Brandon Lau (absent), Mary Mahon (excused), Robert Riechel (present). Also present were Chief of Police Ed Barberini, Cory Wolbach from Senator Jerry Hill's office, Rich Wong (guest), Darlene Esola (guest), Leslie Hatamiya, Executive Director of the San Bruno Community Foundation, and Corporal Howard Hoyer. A quorum was present.
- 3. Approval of Minutes:** Marie moved and Anne seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the March 12th 2015 minutes as distributed. Motion passed unanimously.
- 4. Communications & Announcements:**

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Leslie Hatamiya, Executive Director of the San Bruno Community Foundation gave a short overview of the tasks the foundation has been tasked with. The first task is to gather from San Bruno residents their suggestions on how the foundation should spend the \$70 million dollars provided by P.G.& E. that has been entrusted to them. Several Town Hall style meetings will be scheduled in order to reach out to the public for suggestions. The foundation meets the 3rd Thursday of every month at 6:30 p.m. in City Hall. The public is welcome. Leslie handed out their flier. They will be scheduling one on one interviews with interested citizens. Cory Wolbach from Senator Jerry Hill's office briefly discussed SB 34 on license plate readers; SB 741 on cell phone tracking; SB 494 on earthquake safety fund; and SB 678 biometric sound devices.

Corporal Howard Hoyer discussed the following items as communication items from the Police Department.

A special presentation will be held at the Golden Gate National Cemetery for the "Wall that Heals", from April 9th to April 12th. The traveling wall is a smaller replica of the actual wall in Washington DC to honor the soldiers that lost their life in the Vietnam War.

April is distracted driving awareness month. April 1st and April 15th have been earmarked for special statewide high visibility enforcement days for all law enforcement agencies that are participating in the national traffic safety campaign. A press release from the San Bruno Police Department was handed out showing our support and involvement in the safety campaign.

On Saturday April 25th the American Cancer Society will be holding a fundraising event at Capuchino High School. The event is called "Relay for Life" and will start at 930 am to 1130 pm.

On Friday night April 17th, at 700 pm the San Bruno Police Association members will participate in a charity basketball game against the Parkside Teachers. The Police vs Faculty basketball game has been happening for many years and all the money raised from the event goes to the after school sports program to support the students. Everyone is welcome.

On Thursday April 30th the San Bruno Police Department will be participating in a Tip-a-Cop fundraising event at Chili's Restaurant, in San Bruno. The event is scheduled from 5 pm to 9 pm and all the special tips collected will benefit Special Olympics.

Corporal Hoyer wanted to say thank you to Committee Member Roberto Donlucas for the work he does for InnVision Shelter Network as an Outreach Case Manager for the Homeless Outreach Team. Corporal Hoyer told Roberto that he has received many compliments from San Bruno Police Officers that his outreach to some of the homeless people in our town is working.

5. Staff Reports:

Corporal Hoyer said that he received an e-mail from a Neighborhood Watch Captain that was concerned about some graffiti that was found in the Merimont neighborhood and wanted to know if it was gang related. Corporal Hoyer said that several San Bruno Police Officers told him it was not gang graffiti and probably was just written by a teenager. Corporal Hoyer also told the Neighborhood Watch Captain that there are no known gangs in the Merimont area.

Several inquiries have been made recently about stolen vehicles. Corporal Hoyer gave some suggestions on how to make your vehicle less of a target and some parking suggestions.

Corporal Hoyer provided some information on Property Crime Trends in San Mateo County that he received from the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center.

Police Chief Barberini talked about the recent rise in fraudulent crimes and telephone scams involving suspect(s) identifying themselves as government officials or from the IRS. Please inform everyone that you know that these are scams and no governmental agency would demand money over the telephone and pay by green dot cards. Police Chief Barberini said these crimes are happening everywhere and not just in San Bruno. The Police Chiefs are working together to properly educate the public and work collectively to investigate these crimes.

6. Public Comment on items not on the agenda – No comments were received.

7. Business:

a. Neighborhood Watch –

There was no update on New Block(s) in forming stages.

A discussion on a guide line document on “How to set up a Neighborhood Watch” was postponed until the next meeting. All committee members were asked to bring their written suggestions.

The update on Brochure Distribution re-filling showed the three sites are being refilled.

b. Crime Tips –

Marie moved and Anne seconded the motion to approve the two English and Spanish crime tips for April 2015. The first slide will be “April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month” and the second slide will be “Be a Good Witness”. Motion passed unanimously. Corporal Hoyer will confirm Spanish translations and provide to Miriam at San Bruno Cable for posting.

c. San Bruno Police Department's Emergency Contact List Distribution –

Roberto will distribute Mary's forms and Riechel will finish his. Corporal Hoyer said that he has received over 20 of the emergency contact forms back.

Cpl. Hoyer reported on the progress for the upcoming Police Recognition Day event at Tanforan, on May 16, 2015. Our committee will need an electrical outlet, a monitor, and a laptop to be able to show Roberto's committee video and slide show that we previewed. Everybody complimented Roberto on the committee video and slide show. Riechel will re-send the volunteer sign-up sheet for the event. Corporal Hoyer will turn in our completed RSVP form for the committee.

e. National Night Out August 4th 2015 -

Marie reported she had picked up the N.N.O. materials from Kris and received no replies to her E-Mails to the block captains to see if their neighborhoods will participate in N.N.O. She will call the neighborhood watch block captains. Marie will obtain the necessary park permit for Grundy Park. Marie has registered our participation on the National Town Watch web page.

Police Chief Barberini gave an update on the process, cost, timing to insert 1/3 sheet NNO flier in City water bill. It should happen. Final draft of the insert needs to be approved by May 4, 2015. Corporal Hoyer will handle.

f. By-Laws -

Roberto moved and Marie seconded the motion to approve the San Bruno City Attorney's finished version of our committee By-Laws. Motion passed unanimously. We now need to present this version to the City Council for their approval. Chief of Police Barberini will let us know what steps need to happen next.

g. New Brochures -

Update and Discussion on brochure(s) in the works (Credit Card Fraud) postponed to the next meeting.

h. Embracing Technology –

Roberto gave an update and a discussion on his written handout that he presented at the January meeting. Roberto will finalize his proposal and send it to the San Bruno Police Department for their review.
