SUBJECT: Update on Centennial Mosaic Mural Project

To celebrate the City's Centennial, the Culture and Arts Commission hired an artist and commissioned a Centennial Mosaic Mural to commemorate San Bruno's first 100 years of incorporation. This mural project, to be installed at Posy Park, has now been completed by the artist and is awaiting installation.

In order to install the Centennial Mosaic Mural at Posy Park, the City must first secure a permit from CalTrain and its Joint Powers Board. Efforts to secure this permit commenced in earnest on December 2, 2014 and have been ongoing.

Recently, the City and the JPB generally agreed on the terms and conditions of the mural's installation and are awaiting confirmation of final edits to the agreement. Once the agreement is approved by the City Council and the JPB, the artist will be able to commence the final phase of the project, installation.

SUBJECT: Update on Installation and Unveiling of the Centennial Tile Project at the Swimming Pool Building during Operation Clean Sweep

In a joint initiative of the City's Culture and Arts Commission and Park and Recreation Commission, and to celebrate San Bruno's Centennial, the community was invited to paint 4" x 4" tiles commemorating the City's Centennial. Over 400 tiles were painted. These tiles have all been fired to preserve their art work and will be protected by a plastic covering.

As previously determined by the Commissions, the tiles will be installed on the front of the Swimming Pool Building and affixed to a removable board. They will be unveiled at approximately 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 2, 2015 as part of Operation Clean Sweep.

The purpose of this item is to continue the Commission's discussion regarding the nature and structure of the program.




















