Dear Crestmoor Neighborhood,

The Draft Earl-Glenview Park Master Plan is now available for review on the City's website. This Draft Plan will be presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission at their next Regular Meeting scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 21, 2016 at City Hall, Conference Room 115, located at 567 El Camino Real, San Bruno. At this meeting, the Parks and Recreation Commission will review the Draft Plan and develop feedback and input on the design and amenities which will be presented to the City Council at an upcoming Regular City Council Meeting.

Over the past six months, the City hosted three community workshops to solicit the neighborhood's input on the design and amenities for the Earl-Glenview Park. The City used input from residents, along with park design best practices and the City's standards for parks throughout the community, to develop the Draft Plan which will provide the design framework for the reconstruction of the Earl-Glenview Park.

Residents who are not able to attend the September 21, 2016 meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission and would like an opportunity to provide their input to the Commission, are invited to do so by emailing the City's Community Services Director, Kerry Burns, at kburns@sanbruno.ca.gov. In order to complete the master plan process and move on to the final design and construction of the park, residents are requested to provide their input no later than Tuesday, September 20, 2016.
