




Deaths by Sex




Cases by Age Group




Cases by Sex




New Cases by Day

Because of limited testing capacity, the number of cases detected through testing represents only a small portion of the total number of likely cases in the County. COVID-19 data are reported as timely, accurately, and completely as we have available. Data are updated as we receive information that is more complete and will change over time as we learn more. Cases are lab-confirmed COVID-19 cases reported to San Mateo County Public Health by providers, commercial laboratories, and academic laboratories, including reporting results through the California Reportable Disease Information Exchange. Cases are counted by date the lab result was reported. Death data last updated May 11, 2020.



# Shelter in Place Order

- ▲ San Mateo County health order remains in effect
- ▲ Joint press release issued on May 7, 2020 by local counties:
  - “...Health officers will continue working in collaboration with local elected officials, community and business leaders to find ways to reopen more businesses and activities safely, while sustaining the progress we have made to reduce the spread of the coronavirus. We appreciate that the Governor recognizes that California communities are impacted differently by coronavirus and can make decisions at the local level...”



# Shelter in Place Order

- ▲ Order Modified to Permit “Highly Regulated” Gatherings of Vehicles for School District Graduation Ceremonies
  - Modification issued on May 11, 2020
  - 10 or more vehicles, up to 200
  - Vehicle occupants must be from same household
  - Enclosed vehicles only and face coverings required if windows are down
  - Social distancing required
  - Security and gathering plan required

# Housing

## ▲ Eviction Assistance

- Moratoriums have been adopted to ban residential and commercial evictions in the County of San Mateo
  - On March 24, 2020, the [County Board of Supervisors placed a moratorium on residential evictions](#) for nonpayment of rent that applies throughout the cities and towns of San Mateo County

## ▲ Residential Rent Increase Regulations

- Effective April 28, 2020 and will remain in place until May 31, 2020, unless it is extended by the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors

# Great Plates Delivery Program

## ▲ Eligibility Criteria

### ■ Age:

- Anyone 65 years of age or older
- Anyone 60-64 who is COVID-19 positive OR has been exposed to COVID-19 with written proof from a medical professional
- Anyone 60-64 with an underlying health condition

### ■ Answer “YES” to the Following:

- Live alone or with one other eligible adult
- Do not receive meals from any other federal or state program
- Do not have family, friends, or caregivers who can help with meals
- Unable to prepare or shop for meals
- Have income less than \$74,940 for single person


