








Cases by Sex


- R-eff is the average number of people an infected person will infect
 - Represents rate at which COVID-19 is spreading
 - Value less than 1 means decreasing spread
 - Value greater than 1 means increasing spread


Cases by Age Group




Cases by Race/Ethnicity




New Cases by Day

Because of limited testing capacity, the number of cases detected through testing represents only a small portion of the total number of likely cases in the County. COVID-19 data are reported as timely, accurately, and completely as we have available. Data are updated as we receive information that is more complete and will change over time as we learn more. Cases are lab-confirmed COVID-19 cases reported to San Mateo County Public Health by providers, commercial laboratories, and academic laboratories, including reporting results through the California Reportable Disease Information Exchange. A lab-confirmed case is defined as detection of SARS-CoV-2 RNA in a clinical specimen using a molecular amplification detection test. Cases are counted by date the lab result was reported. Deaths reported in this dashboard include only San Mateo County residents; death data last updated September 7, 2020.



STATE'S BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY



Blueprint for a Safer Economy

County risk level	New cases	Positive tests
WIDESPREAD Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed	More than 7 daily new cases (per 100k)	More than 8% Positive tests
SUBSTANTIAL Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed	4 - 7 daily new cases (per 100k)	5 - 8% Positive tests
MODERATE Some indoor business operations are open with modifications	1 - 3.9 daily new cases (per 100k)	2 - 4.9% Positive tests
MINIMAL Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	Less than 1 daily new cases (per 100k)	Less than 2% Positive tests



Blueprint for a Safer Economy

WIDESPREAD

Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed

- ▲ Some businesses that could not operate indoors, can now be open at 25% capacity
- ▲ Some businesses were closed for indoor operations and remain unable to operate indoors, but are allowed to operate outdoors (if allowed by local rules)
- ▲ And Some businesses were closed 100% and remain closed




LOCAL OUTDOOR REGULATIONS



Local Outdoor Regulations

- ▲ Dining
- ▲ Cardrooms
- ▲ Personal Care Services (hair care, nail salons, massage, tanning and tailoring)
- ▲ Gyms
- ▲ Non-Critical Businesses (offices)
- ▲ Places of Worship



- Social Distancing Protocols and Safety Plans for Businesses
- No Mass Gatherings
- Other Orders (i.e. Quarantine, and Isolation) Remain in Effect
