All City facilities are temporarily closed. Appointments for essential counter services are available by contacting City Departments by phone (see pg. 4 for numbers).

Police, Fire, Medical, and City utility services will continue. This includes emergency repair permits and other services deemed necessary to protect the health and welfare of our community.

Public meetings for Boards, Committees, and Commissions are cancelled or postponed until further notice. Regular City Council meetings will be held virtually and live streamed on San Bruno's YouTube channel and local Channel 1.

All City recreation programs and events are cancelled. Including all library events, sporting leagues, fitness classes, spring camps and senior programs.

City playgrounds, fields, tennis courts, basketball courts, dog parks, public picnic areas, and public restrooms are closed.

After School Adventures (ASA), Afterschool Education and Safety (ASES), and the San Bruno Public Library's Homework Center are closed until regular school sessions resume.

All regular programming and special events at the Senior Center are cancelled until further notice.



# **Fiscal Sustainability**

As we experience the second 30-day period of the Shelter in Place order, the longer-term economic impacts of COVID-19 are revealing themselves to be quite severe and impactful to the local businesses, residents, and the resources that the City relies on to provide services to the community.

The City projects the financial impact from COVID-19 on the current budget to be \$2.7 million for direct expenditures related to the public health crisis and loss of revenue – primarily from reduced sales and hotel taxes. This, combined with the mid-year budget shortfall that the City Council substantially resolved in February, means that the City is on track to experience more than a 10% reduction (\$5+ million) in General Fund revenues this fiscal year (July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020).

Measure G, the new ½ cent local sales tax, was estimated to generate \$1 million between April 2020 – June 2020. As a result of COVID-19, expected revenue from the same period is now \$150,000. Thankfully, this will not negatively impact the current budget because the City Council chose to wait until the revenue was received before deciding on its use.

Immediate deficit reduction strategies are being developed to resolve the projected shortfall related to COVID-19 in the current fiscal year. The City Manager's recommendation to resolve the deficit will be provided to the City Council on or before the third quarter financial update, scheduled to occur in May 2020.

In regard to the long-term fiscal challenges faced by the City, we cannot simply tax or cut our way to fiscal sustainability. Trimmings to the City's budget and hard decisions around which programs and services will continue must be made. New tax revenue streams will continue to be explored, however, our best strategy to return the City to a solid financial footing is growing the City's tax base with new and revitalized commercial and residential development. This is the principal driver behind the Transit Corridors Plan and the Bayhill Specific Plan – two efforts that are underway with proposed projects to come before the City Council for action this calendar year.

# Homelessness During COVID-19

The Shelter in Place order applies to those with and without housing. These are challenging times for all and our collective resolve to help those without shelter during this difficult time is even greater.

Unfortunately, one of the hard truths is that some in the homeless community do not accept shelter and services when offered. The reasons for not accepting services are many and, even in times like this when additional housing options are made available, a small portion of the homeless community is resistant to shelter and services. COVID-19 has not changed that, and in some cases, it's heightened fears of accepting assistance.

The last official count of San Bruno's unsheltered population revealed a total of 12 individuals sleeping on our streets or in vehicles. While this number fluctuates, at present, there does not appear to have been a significant expansion in our daily homeless population. However, some parts of the community are facing additional impacts from homelessness during the Shelter in Place order.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and San Mateo County are encouraging communities to avoid enforcement actions on homeless encampments at this time.

In addition, CDC interim guidelines on homelessness for COVID-19 suggests that removing encampments may create more risk to public health than it resolves. The CDC advises that clearing encampments can cause individuals to disperse throughout the community, thereby increasing the potential for infectious disease spread.

Due to the potential for COVID-19 spread, the CDC encourages communities to partner with organizations that can provide housing resources, behavioral health services, and nutrition services to encourage those that are willing to accept these services to move towards community assimilation. San Bruno has done just that. City staff and our homeless outreach coordinator, LifeMoves, are continuing to offer services and shelter during this public health crisis

Additionally, to address the accumulation of belongings and trash at encampments during the Shelter in Place order, the City has stepped up efforts to empty public trash cans and reduce debris in and around homeless encampments. You can report an area needing attention to SB Responds. The public should know that the removal of some debris at encampments may not be immediately successful, as the City must give members of the encampment proper notice to collect and separate their belongings from the items that will be disposed of.

## San Bruno Responds

San Bruno Responds is an online reporting tool to submit service requests (illegal dumping, potholes, sidewalk issues, graffiti, tree concerns, etc.) via our mobile app or website directly to the City of San Bruno.

With San Bruno Responds, service requests are easily submitted by completing a short description of the request. A picture of the issue can be included in order to provide additional details. The mobile app will automatically know the issue location and the chosen request type will ensure that the issue is sent to the appropriate department in the City. The submitter and subsequent followers will be able to track the request through to its resolution. All requests are sorted and assigned a priority by City staff, and will be processed accordingly.

The Foundation, led by Executive Director Leslie Hatamiya, jumped at the opportunity and quickly organized volunteer opportunities and groups seeking financial donations that directly impact the San Bruno community. A COVID-19 How You Can Help webpage was developed. This was quickly followed by two additional webpages that summarized resources for San Bruno businesses and resources for nonprofits.

When the need arose for financial support to assist families in need with home internet access, the Foundation fast-tracked a \$10,000 grant to ensure that PreK-12 students in San Bruno could have internet access at no cost.
